## Lincoln, Abraham, 1809-1865.

**About**  
Born: Feb 12, 1809  
Died: Apr 15, 1865  
Abraham Lincoln (/əˈbræhɑːm ˈlɪŋkən/ (February 12, 1809 – April 15, 1865) was the 16th President of the United States, serving from March 1861 until his assassination in April 1865. Lincoln led the United States through its Civil War—its bloodiest war and its greatest moral, constitutional and political crisis. In so doing he preserved the Union, abolished slavery, strengthened the federal government, and modernized the economy. Reared in a poor family on the western frontier, Lincoln was a self-educated lawyer in Illinois, a Whig Party leader, state legislator during the 1830s, and a one-term member of the Congress during the 1840s. He promoted rapid modernization of the economy.




## Libraries Leverage Wikimedia

what to do in case of an opiate/heroin overdose

- Stimulate** - can they be awakened?
- Call for help** - if the person is not responsive
- Airway** - make sure there is nothing inside the person's mouth stopping them from breathing
- Rescue breathing** - two quick breaths then one breath every five seconds.
- Evaluate** - are they any better? can you get naloxone and prepare if quick enough that they won't go long without your breathing assistance?
- Medication delivery** - give dose of IM naloxone into muscle or nasal spray.
- Evaluate and support** - is the person breathing on their own? is another dose needed? call 911 or 800-995-6633 for help and support.


