I. SHARES Principles

A. SHARES libraries should:

 Work cooperatively within and across interlibrary loan, special collections, preservation, and/or digitization units at our libraries to consider and fill interlibrary loan requests for special collections materials.

PRINCIPLES AND PROTOCOLS



Principles

- Framework of expectations
- General ground rules
- Subdivided into those that apply to:
 - All participating SHARES libraries
 - Those who borrow special collections
 - Those who lend special collections





Protocols

- Outlines workflows with steps involved
- Based on real world experiences
- Customizable
- Workflows
 - Article/chapter scans
 - Digitizing entire works
 - Lending physical loans
 - Packaging and shipping
 - Borrowing physical loans


